- Filmed in Gibson Hotel in Dublin;
- Over 20 cameras;
- Couples filmed both front and backstage;
- At the end of the date, the couples are interviewed together and asked whether they would like to see each other again;
- Restaurant closed to the public but you can apply to be a 'background' dater;
- Each diner given £25 towards the cost of their meal*;
- UK, USA, Ireland, Australia, Italy, Canada, Spain, Sweden, Poland, Israel.
